Letter from the **President**

To make that happen in an entire year consumed by a global pandemic, we witnessed relentless demonstrations of commitment, creativity, and courage. Our donors remained faithful to the mission, displaying extraordinary commitment to the life-changing importance of wishes. Our volunteers, medical advisors, and Board reached deep into their creativity to ensure that every granted wish was safe and spectacular. Our staff embodied courage in confronting every challenge with grace, humility, and determination. So yes, it very clearly took a fully engaged and diverse community to grant these 100 wishes.

Also exemplifying the devotion of our wish community was all of the work that led to the creation of Stargaze — our five-year strategic plan. We spent most of the past 12 months building a vision of our future

that energizes us all. The centerpiece of the timeline was a two-day summit designed to dream about what Make-A-Wish Eastern North Carolina might look like five years from now. Remarkably, 43 members of our wish community, from all constituencies, participated throughout those two days. Stargaze is a truly collective, community-led strategy that will carry us to an even better tomorrow.

This is now my third Annual Report in my time at this post. Even after three years, it is hard for words to capture the sublime beauty that lives within each granted wish. 35 years of wishes coming true.

For 35 years, Make-A-Wish Eastern North Carolina has served medically eligible children who reside in the 49-county chapter area east of the Orange/Alamance county line — serving the Triangle to the coast. Our goal is to reach every eligible child in our chapter area and grant their wish. Since our inception in 1986, the organization has granted more than 4,000 wishes, at zero cost to the families we serve. We operate solely through generous donations of individuals, corporations, organizations, and foundations, as well as with the help of more than 350 volunteers, including our Board of Directors.

To be eligible to receive a wish, the child:

- ★ Must reside in our 49-county chapter area
- ★ Must be diagnosed with a critical illness such as a progressive, degenerative, or malignant condition that has placed the child's life in jeopardy
- ★ Must be between 2½ 18 years of age at the time of referral and have not received a wish from Make-A-Wish OR another wish-granting organization

Six-year-old Maggie lives in Wake County and has always been an active, healthy child — she especially loves being outdoors playing soccer or swimming. One day Maggie came home from soccer practice with severe pains, a moment that would forever change her world. As she began a difficult journey with cancer treatment, she had to take a break from many of these activities that she loved.

Maggie has always loved the magic of mermaids, using her creative mind to envision a world below the sea where there are lots of adventures. As Maggie was recovering from her treatments and in better health, she was spending lots of time outdoors and practicing her swimming again. She immediately knew what her wish would be. **She wanted to go on a mermaid adventure!** Maggie and her family were able to take some much needed time away at a beach house in the Outer Banks...a location rumored to have mermaids! One morning during their vacation, Maggie and her family walked out onto the beach and found Mermaid Shannon ready to spend the day with her!

Mermaid Shannon presented Maggie with her very own mermaid tail, bringing her into their now-shared special mermaid world, and they spent the morning on the beach together splashing in the water and playing in the sand. In the afternoon, Mermaid Shannon met Maggie back at her beach house for a mermaid pool party including a mermaid make-up session (hint: always include lots of glitter), a custom mermaid cake, and an opportunity to practice swimming in their mermaid tails! Maggie is now officially a mermaid after her wish day, and she and her family will always cherish the memories of their week at the beach together.

We celebrated 35 years of granting wishes





Benny Strickland was an eight-year-old boy from Roanoke Rapids, NC suffering from leukemia when he became the very first wish recipient for Make-A-Wish Eastern North Carolina in 1986. Benny wished to meet his favorite wrestlers — Magnum T.A. and tag team the Rock 'N Roll Express. So, before a show, Magnum T.A. visited Benny in Duke University Medical Center, and the following weekend Benny and his family traveled to Atlanta for a taping of a wrestling show at WTBS where he met the Rock 'N Roll Express!

Benny's wish came roughly six months after the chapter was founded, laying the groundwork for now more than 4,000 wishes for children in eastern North Carolina.

We elected our first Make-A-Wish alumni on our board!

Rashawn King was an all-star athlete in high school. But in June 2010, he was diagnosed with leukemia and spent the next three months in UNC Children's Hospital fighting for his life.

After being released from the hospital, Rashawn returned back to school for his senior year. To give back to his school community and the people who supported him during his cancer journey, he decided to use his wish to feed his entire high school Chick-fil-A for lunch one day.

We granted our 4,000th wish: a sport court for wish kid Luke

16-year-old Luke has autism and has always enjoyed the structure and fun of sports, time spent with his family, and the opportunity to be outdoors. But in 2019, Luke was diagnosed with leukemia. The diagnosis and chemotherapy treatments changed life drastically for Luke and his family, as Luke hates needles and likes routines. Going through treatment limited Luke's activities, and in 2020 the COVID-19 pandemic further limited the activities he could enjoy.

When Luke's medical team told him about Make-A-Wish, he knew he wanted to have a sport court in his yard so he could stay active and play sports with his siblings! Make-A-Wish Eastern North Carolina partnered with Carolina Sport Court to build a custom, multi-purpose sport court in Luke's yard where he can play basketball, tennis, volleyball, and other sports safely at home.



Luke's wish marked an important milestone for our chapter, as it was our 4,000th wish! We brought together members of our wish community, our new friends from Carolina Sport Court, and Luke's family to enjoy an afternoon of socially-distanced fun on Luke's new court. Donors Steve and Sofia Wiley also attended! Luke and his brother shot baskets and our community cheered every time he made a shot. Luke's enthusiasm and joy was visible to everyone there, and we know he'll enjoy his sport court for many years to come.

Today, Rashawn is a father of one, an employee at NC State University, and a business owner of his own nonprofit. This past year, he became the first Wish Alumni to join our board!


Speaking of Wish Alumni, we also launched our Wish Alumni Program this year — a meaningful way to stay involved with our wish families continuing their wish journeys!
